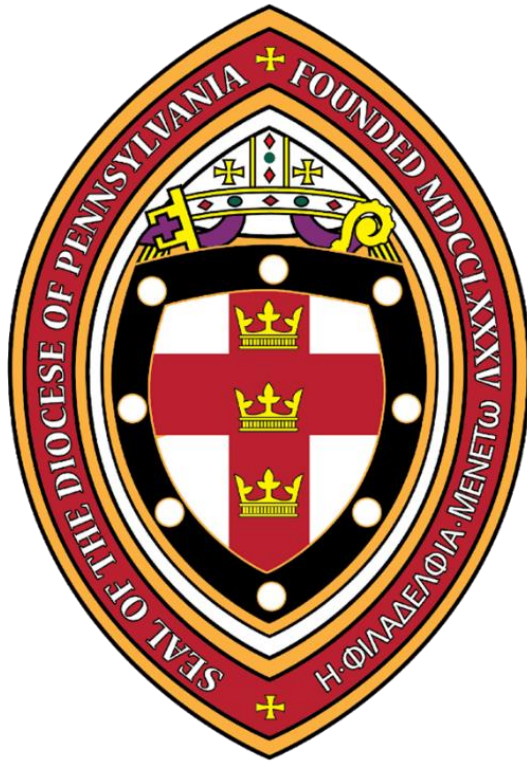

Bishop Gutiérrez, we have come together today to welcome The Reverend Rodney Roehner, who has been chosen to serve as Rector of St. Matthew's Church in Maple Glen. We believe that he is well qualified, and that he has been prayerfully and lawfully selected.

The Induction

Representatives of the congregation and of the clergy of the diocese stand before the Bishop with the new Rector.

Representatives of the congregation present a Bible, saying

Rodney, accept this Bible, and be among us as one who proclaims the Word.

People **Amen.**

The Bishop presents a vessel of water, saying

Rodney, take this water, and help me baptize in obedience to our Lord.

People **Amen.**

Others present a stole, saying

Rodney, receive this stole, and be among us as a pastor and priest.

People **Amen.**

Others present a Book of Common Prayer, saying

Rodney, receive this Book of Common Prayer, and be among us as a man of prayer.

People **Amen.**

Others present olive oil, saying

Rodney, use this oil, and be among us as a healer and reconciler.

People **Amen.**

A Warden presents the keys of the church, saying

Rodney, receive these keys, and let the doors of this place be open to all people.

People **Amen.**

Representative clergy of the diocese present the Constitution and Canons of this Church, saying

Rodney, obey these Canons, and be among us to share in the councils of this diocese.

People **Amen.**

Other Representatives of the Altar Guild present bread and wine, saying

Rodney, take this bread and wine, and be among us to break the Bread and bless the Cup.

People **Amen.**

Representatives of St. Matthew's Preschool present a school bell, saying

Rodney, take this school bell and be among us as we teach the young children of this community of the Lord's love and grace.

People **Amen.**

The Bishop then says

Rodney, let all these be signs of the ministry which is mine and yours in this place.

People **Amen.**

The new Rector then kneels in the midst of the church, and says

O Lord my God, I am not worthy to have you come under my roof; yet you have called your servant to stand in your house, and to serve at your altar. To you and to your service I devote myself, body, soul, and spirit. Fill my memory with the record of your mighty works; enlighten my understanding with the light of your Holy Spirit; and may all the desires of my heart and will center in what you would have me do. Make me an instrument of your salvation for the people entrusted to my care, and grant that I may faithfully administer your holy Sacraments, and by my life and teaching set forth your true and living Word. Be always with me in carrying out the duties of my ministry. In prayer, quicken my devotion; in praises, heighten my love and gratitude; in preaching, give me readiness of thought and expression; and grant that, by the clearness and brightness of your holy Word, all the world may be drawn into your blessed kingdom. All this I ask for the sake of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ.

People **Amen.**

The Bishop then presents the new rector and his family to the congregation, saying

Greet your new Rector.

The Congregation expresses its approval. Applause is appropriate.

The Bishop greets the new Rector, who then says to the people

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People **And also with you.**

The new Rector then greets other members of the clergy, family members, and the congregation. The People greet one another.

The Bishop continues

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."
