### **MINISTRY UPDATES**

### **Hearing God Bible Study**

This Bible Study continues in October on Tuesday evenings from 7:30 - 8:45pm, except on Vestry weeks when we meet on Wednesdays. Here are the topics that are finishing up our Bible Study in October. Remember, it is not necessary to read the book. You are welcome to join us at any time.

**October 3 (Tuesday):** Question to be discussed: Do you want to hear God's still, small voice? In this session we will read 1 Kings 19:2-18 and explore that God speaks primarily in the still, small voice as we develop a conversational relationship.

**October 11 (Wednesday):** Question to be discussed: What if you hear something unexpected or unwanted? In this session we will read Acts 10:9-23, 44-48, and recognize that God may say unexpected things and ask us to interact with unfamiliar people.

**October 17 (Tuesday):** Question to be discussed: What might happen if you work as a colaborer with God? In our last session, we will read 1 Chronicles 14:8-17 and observe how colaborers with God freely engage in conversation with God.

#### **Decision Point & Youth Group & Youth Mission Trip**

**Decision Point** is our Sunday School curriculum for Middle School and High School Youth. Our curriculum is based on navigating through life by making choices. Each session has short video segments which lead to discussion questions and journaling in a workbook. Our youth ensure that our discussions are lively, engaging, and pertinent to today's situations.

**Youth Group** is also made up of Middle School and High School Youth. The events planned for October and November include:

October 8: 4:00 – 6:00pm – Topic: Animals are a Blessing - Bring your animals for the annual Blessing of the Animals and for sharing and conversation about if we treat our animals better than other people in our lives?

**November 5: 4:00 – 6:00pm – Topic: What's on your mind?** – We will have dinner and a discussion, hopefully around a fire pit.

**November 19: 4:00 – 6:00pm – Topic: Gratitude** – We will take donations for the Little Pantry and discuss the importance of gratitude in our journey and share what we are thankful for and why.

We are currently **investigating potential Mission Trip opportunities** for summer of 2024. We are considering a Youth Works sponsored trip to Niagara Falls. A mission trip is an experience for youth and adults to go out into the world to help those in need, whether the needs are physical or spiritual. Our intergenerational group will come alongside existing organizations to meet ongoing needs through food and clothing distribution, home repair projects, community beautification projects, and youth programming at a local community center. After the service day, the group will learn more about the community by participating in evening activities to experience some of the hardships of those living in poverty, visit the beauty of the Falls and share a time of fellowship with partners and community members.

**Consecration Sunday - New date!** Our annual pledges are given in thanksgiving and gratitude to God for our many blessings. Consecration Sunday, the day we come forward to offer our annual pledge for 2024, will take place on **Christ the King Sunday, November 26**. Take time to reflect how grateful you are for this community and God's presence among us as you contemplate your 2024 pledge.

### **NURSERY SCHOOL UPDATE**

This year the Nursery School opened its doors on Monday. September 11, 2023. The 2 ½ year old classes began with a visiting day in which a parent comes to school with their child and stays to play and visit with the teacher and aide. The 3 year old classes begin with a short session in which students come by themselves for an hour. The 4-year old and Pre-K classes begin with a regular full day. By the second day of school, almost all of the children are settled in and happy and ready for lots of fun!

This year the nursery school welcomes several new staff members:

- Mrs. Louise Kadingo will teach the 3's T-TH Class.
- Mrs. Krista Forst will assist in the 2 ½'s T-TH and 4's MWF classes.
- · Mrs. Samantha Spingler will teach our morning and afternoon Pre-K classes, and
- Mrs. Lauren Freda will assist on Thursdays in our 4's M-TH class.

All have had their own children or grandchildren come through St. Matthew's, and will be wonderful additions to our staff this year!

The Nursery School children will again be participating in Chapel with Father Rodney, Music with Mrs. Martha Reynolds and Gym with Coach Barry and Coach Jocelyn. They will enjoy many programs that visit the school- the Horsham Fire Company, Horsham Police Department, Gold Fish Swim School, and a traveling farm. The 3 and 4 year old classes will visit several different places in the community for field trips. Enrichment classes are held weekly for children in the 4 year old and Pre-K classes and include: Mathemagic, Science, Book and Cook, Kreative Kids, and Reading, Writing and Fun. The 3 year old classes can participate in Kids in Motion as well as Sensational Art.

In late September the 4's and Pre-K Classes went to Tabora Farms for a wagon ride and apple picking. In October the 3's classes will visit Kohler Farms for a hayride and pumpkin picking. The school will also join the church for a Trunk or Treat at the end of October. Over the summer the classrooms all received a fresh coat of paint as well as the hallways. A special thank you to Bill Reynolds for all that he did to prep for the painters and for power washing the playground equipment. ### **Highlighting - Antonia Greene-Edwards**

### Reflecting on what it means to serve ...

Greetings Church family! I am Toni Edwards, a member of our Vestry and VBS ministry. As we prepare for the season of giving, I was asked to reflect about my time in the military and how it feels now to be retired from the service. I remember the feeling, being led by the Spirit and joining Army ROTC just after the tragic events of Sept. 11th, 2001. I was a sophomore at Temple University and amidst all the assignments, excitement and distractions, recall an undeniable sense of duty, of obligation, of servitude stirring within. It was underpinned by an unflinching courage I had never felt before and I knew then, God was with me.

He solidified His will and sent a messenger, the late Master Sergeant Anthony Middleton, an ROTC instructor who ultimately became my 20+ year mentor and closest confidant. During my training and my state-side missions, I discovered my true potential, surpassed physical, mental and emotional limits I didn't know I had, grew in confidence and humility; grounded in faith. At war, I drew closer to the Lord than ever before, experienced His living power firsthand and came to know His ways are not ours. Amid suffering and loss, I found hope and strength. Undeniably the most defining chapter of my life. The Lord is my shepherd, my rock, my salvation. Psalm 23 and 62 - my soul's song.

As I look back and begin to reflect on my time of service, I am reminded of Jesus' example of a good and faithful servant. That we are all called to serve first, to share and multiply the unique gifts the Spirit has blessed us with and do so in service to others without expectation of reward or reciprocation. This parallels Army life. Some say "bearing our Nation's burden" but I've come to know that it is following in Christ. There are crosses to bear and hardships we carry forever - with service comes sacrifice, but over the course of my career I learned giving selflessly is its own reward. I am rich in experience, in meaningful human connections and above all in communion with God. Having served, I gained so much more than I have lost. I will continue to trust in Him, serving when and where the Spirit moves me. I am thankful, grateful and truly blessed.



### TREASURER'S REPORT

Revenues and Expenses: August YTD operating net income (excludes Bequests and Memorials) is \$10K. This is \$54K better than the planned loss at this point of (\$44K). These positive results are due to pledge collections close to budget (Thank You!), strong non-pledge receipts (mostly Preschool tuition and fees and plate collections) and expenses below budget (helped by having no snow this past winter). We expect that this positive margin may erode somewhat over the next several months, but we should end the year better than budgeted.

Capital Spending: Only \$7K of the planned \$24K in capital projects has been spent so far this year (Sacristy door repairs and painting in the PreSchool) because cost estimates on some planned projects were significantly higher than expected, causing a need for reevaluation. In turn, this may cause some spending to spill over into next year.

**Bequests:** With thanks to God, we received three bequests totaling \$70K this year. St. Mattew's has long been blessed by the generosity of its members in giving above and beyond annual pledging. I urge you to take a moment and prayerfully give thanks when you next walk past the Tree of Life in the hallway outside the sanctuary!

**Cash and Investments:** Given the \$10K in operating net income and the \$70K in Bequest proceeds, our cash and money market balances are up by \$80K compared to the end of last year. Our investment accounts have also increased by 6 percent this year. Altogether our unrestricted funds total nearly \$1.5M.
