That is what people see in us. May God grant us the grace to lovingly and tenaciously hold on to that through word and deed

#### 10:30 Choir

"St. Matthew's has recently added to its Music Ministry with the addition of a Handchime Choir. Fourteen people of varying ages and musical knowledge joined together to make beautiful music. Our first pieces were Amazing Grace and Simple Gifts.

The handchimes were a memorial gift given to St. Matthew's by Bill and Dorothea Graham in loving memory of Dorothea's long-time voice teacher, Mrs. Marion Walker. Mrs. Walker lived to be 102 years old and passed in the year 2000.

Mrs. Walker, a Michigan native, became a resident of Bucks County in 1947 and soon after opened her Temora Studio of Music. She was a conductor of the Bucks County Choral Society. Mrs. Walker was a contralto soloist and graduate of Oberlin College in Ohio.

Dorothea began her 20-plus year relationship with Mrs. Walker in 1966, when Dorothea was 14 years old. Most people can look back over the years and find the person who impacted them the most. Mrs. Marion Walker was more than a vocal coach. She was a mentor, a teacher, a listener, and a friend. Hearing and participating in the handchime choir, brought back many beautiful memories of a kind and caring woman, who Dorothea and Bill are so grateful to have known."

The Handchime choir will offer special music at the 10:30 a.m.service on a regular basis . We hope you will come and listen and be inspired!

## **NURSERY SCHOOL UPDATE**

We are approaching the holiday season. The Nursery School children will spend November with activities related to Thanksgiving, autumn, foods and nutrition. Many of the classes will be preparing a feast to celebrate the Thanksgiving Holiday. Parents will also join their children to celebrate the Thanksgiving Feasts at the end of November.

The first of two Parent Teacher Conferences will be held at the beginning of November. Conferences are for all classes from the 2 ½'s to the Pre-K. This is a wonderful opportunity for parents to sit and talk with their child's teacher one on one about how their child has adjusted socially to school, who their friends are and what activities they enjoy participating in school. The conference is also a great time for parents to discuss with the teacher which class to register their child for the next school year.

We begin pre-registering children for the 2024-2025 school year at the end of November. Existing families in the nursery school will register their children the last week of November into the first week of December. The second week of December is set aside for church members to register their children and the third week of December we open registration to the community. The school children are anticipating the many Christmas festivities that will take place. On Saturday, December 2nd we will have our Family lunch with Santa. This is a fun event where families join together for lunch in the parish hall. Our Christmas Concerts will take place this year on December 20th and December 21st. Mrs. Reynolds, our music teacher, will be working with the children in music class preparing them with Christmas songs old and new. Families will come to the church for the Concert and then head downstairs to their classrooms for parties with their children. The Nursery School will be closed from December 22nd until January 2nd for Christmas Break.

The Treasurer's Report in the last Oracle featured a table with a ton of numbers, and lots of text. So, for this edition we're going to test the adage about a picture being worth a thousand words!

Those two small blue columns may not look like much, but they signify that our collections so far this year were higher than our spending. This speaks to both the support of our parishioners and PreSchool families and the care with which we manage our spending (together with a little luck in having had no snow last winter).



And you may wonder what "operating" means in the chart title. For Revenues it means that the \$70K in Bequests received this year is not included. Similarly, the \$7K that we have spent so far on capital projects (Sacristy door repairs and painting in the PreSchool) is not included in Expenses.

Look for more "pictures" in the next Oracle that will show how we are doing compared to our budget. (Spoiler alert – it's good news!)

## **PILGRIMAGE**

#### Sacred Travel - Going on a Pilgrimage

Have you ever considered going on a pilgrimage? Do you even know what a pilgrimage is? How does it differ from going on vacation? Could a pilgrimage be the way you decide to spend your vacation?

Why wouldn't you want to journey to a sacred place to deepen in your relationship with God? A pilgrimage is a journey to a place associated with someone or something well-known or respected, or simply viewed as a journey of personal transformation. The word "pilgrimage" comes from the Latin word "peregrinus" meaning "foreigner" or "traveler."

Although I have done several spiritual retreats, going on a "pilgrimage" was new to me. But, when I read about a pilgrimage to Greece in October of 2023, given by 206 Tours to follow in the footsteps of the Apostle Paul, I knew instantly that I had to go. I wanted to see the places where the Apostle Paul traveled as he wrote his letters to churches. I hoped to marvel and wonder how the church was built after Jesus's resurrection and how Paul's work and others eventually spread the good news about Jesus Christ across the world.

During my pilgrimage, I saw the town of Philippi where Paul was in prison (Acts 16), I saw the town of Ephesus where Paul was put on trial (Acts 19), I saw monasteries built on the top of mountains of rocks, I saw the island of Patmos and the Grotto (cave) where John received his vision which is written in the Book of Revelation. What surprised me about my pilgrimage was the opportunity it gave me to develop relationships with the other pilgrims on the trip. We grew closer because of our shared experiences, and we celebrated masses together that highlighted the things we were seeing and doing. We learned that our shared responsibility would be to tell others about our journey.

One of the most memorable spiritual experiences we could have, as a congregation, would be to go on a pilgrimage. Now is the time to begin thinking about travel plans for 2025. Think about the sacred places we could travel . . . Think about what you would like to see? . . . What would you like to experience? . . . How might you deepen your spiritual life in Jesus Christ? . . . Let Father Rodney know about your interests as we would like to begin planning our first pilgrimage for 2025. What better blessing can there be than to pilgrim with other parishioners to a sacred place to be in the presence of Jesus Christ?


